INTRODUCTION

Recovery Doesn't End at Discharge

Surgery is often just one part of the healing process.

Once home, patients and families are suddenly responsible for:

- New physical limitations
- Pain management routines
- Medication schedules
- Mobility restrictions
- Emotional and mental adjustment

More Than Just Rest

Post-surgical recovery often includes:

- Fatigue and reduced endurance
- Temporary loss of independence
- Pain or discomfort with movement
- Emotional ups and downs
- Fear of doing “too much” or “too little”

Healing requires balance between rest and activity, independence and support.

THE FIRST FEW DAYS AT HOME

Focus: Safety, Comfort, and Routine

In the first days after surgery, priorities should include:

- Creating a calm, predictable routine
- Supporting safe movement and transfers
- Ensuring pain is addressed and monitored
- Encouraging hydration and light nutrition
- Keeping the environment clean and clutter-free
- Monitoring for changes or complications

This is not the time to rush recovery.



MOBILITY & MOVEMENT
SUPPORT

Supporting Safe Activity

Movement is often encouraged but must be safe and gradual.

Helpful practices include:

- Assisting with walking as recommended
- Encouraging slow, deliberate movements
- Using prescribed mobility aids consistently
- Avoiding rushing, especially when fatigued
- Allowing frequent rest periods

Confidence in movement reduces risk and anxiety.



PAIN AWARENESS &
COMFORT

Understanding Post-Surgical Discomfort

Some discomfort is expected after surgery but pain should be monitored, not ignored.

Families should:

- Encourage taking medications as prescribed
- Watch for unmanaged or worsening pain
- Note pain that limits basic movement
- Communicate concerns promptly

Pain that interferes with daily function deserves attention.



DAILY LIVING SUPPORT
DURING RECOVERY

Where Help Makes a Difference

During recovery, individuals may need assistance with:

- Bathing and personal hygiene
- Dressing and grooming
- Meal preparation and hydration
- Light housekeeping
- Transportation to follow-up appointments

Support in these areas allows the body to focus on healing.



COMMON WARNING
SIGNS TO WATCH FOR

Communicate With a Care Professional If You Notice:

- Increasing pain that doesn't improve
 - Redness, swelling, or warmth near surgical areas
 - Fever or chills
 - Sudden changes in mobility
 - Confusion or unusual fatigue
 - Shortness of breath

Early communication helps prevent complications.

A key part of recovery is encouraging independence when safe.

Support should:

- Assist where needed
- Step back when appropriate
- Promote confidence
- Prevent injury

This balance allows individuals to heal while maintaining dignity and autonomy.
